



Lesson 6: What Does She Looks Like

Lesson Objective

By the end of this lesson, you will be able to:

- ✓ Asking about and describing people's appearance
- √ Identifying people

After we get to know someone, of course we want to tell our friends or family about our new friend. So, what do we usually tell about our new friends? We may tell about how they look like.



Let's describe Maya!

This is my friend Maya.

Maya is tall and slim. She is young and beautiful.

Maya has straight black hair.
She has brown eyes and a small nose.

Maya usually wears her hair in a ponytail.

His name is
Andre. He is
American.
Andre has an
athletic body.
He has brown
eyes. He has
brown wavy
hair. His face is
clean-shaven.







To describe someone's **height (tall), build (body type), and age**, we use **to be + adjective.** (See the sentences in yellow highlight)

Other examples:

- I am tall and slim
- He is chubby
- You are young and athletic
- His body is muscular

Or, we may also use the structure with has/have + a/an + adjective + build/body. (See the sentences in green highlight).

Other examples:

- She has a tall body
- Mike has a muscular build
- I have a chubby body

To describe someone's eye color, hair (color, type, length), and other facial features, we may use the verb 'has'/'have'. (See the sentences in blue highlight)

Other examples:

- Mark has blue eyes
- I have a pointy nose
- The twins have blonde curly hair

We may also use the verb 'wear' to describe hairstyles:

- Maya wears a ponytail
- I have my hair in a bun


Also, for men, we may describe their facial feature using these expressions:

- His face is clean-shaven
- He has beard
- Mark has moustache





Refer to the following diagram about description on facial hair and hairstyles!



BrE: British English; NAmE: American English

Useful expressions for people's appearance:

- What does she/he look like?
- Does she/he have curly hair?
- How tall are you?
- Who's got curly hair?

IMPORTANT: we **SHOULD NOT** ask about people's weight! We may ask about their build or body type, but not about their exact weight as it is rude and impolite.
